Saifullah Paracha has been in Guantánamo since September 2004. He suffers chest pains, fainting spells and breathing difficulties as a result of heart disease. He has refused treatment because he believes the medical care available in the camp is inadequate.

Saifullah Paracha was seized at Bangkok airport in Thailand in July 2003 on his way to a business meeting. He was hooded and cuffed, thrown into the back of a vehicle and taken to an unknown location. He was later transferred by US authorities to Bagram in Afghanistan, where he was held for over a year before being transferred to Guantánamo. US authorities say that Saifullah Paracha is affiliated to al-Qa'ida. He denies the allegation. Despite his heart problems, he is being held in isolation in harsh conditions in Camp 5.

ACT NOW

- Call for Saifullah Paracha to be released from Guantánamo or charged promptly and given a fair trial.
- Urge that independent medical experts be allowed to visit him to assess his health and treatment needs.
